In the left-hand column are four suggestions for your RLAs. Aim for 3-stars for an awesome RLA and 2-stars for a solid RLA. You might not always have time to hit 2 or 3 stars for every RLA, and that's okay too.

1. Follow the timeframe (meet the suggested due date).	You share (post) your RLAs on time. This gives others a chance to read yours and comment.	Your RLA is shared a few days after the deadline. Others read it but may not have time to comment.	Your RLA is shared late. Others don't have time to read it or comment.
2. Present your RLA in a way that everyone can understand. Use plain language, audio or photos.	Everyone wants to read/look at your RLA because you presented it in a way that's fun and easy to understand.	Most people read your RLA and can understand your ideas.	Some people find your RLA confusing or difficult to read and understand.
3. Prepare your RLA in a way that contributes to everyone's learning.	Your RLA adds depth to the learning event; you share new ideas and/or encourage new perspectives.	Your RLA shares an example related to the learning event and helps others understand the content.	Your RLA shares some interesting information but doesn't quite fit with the learning event.
4. Engage with others by reading and commenting on their RLAs.	You respond respectfully with suggestions or questions to (at least) one person's RLA.	You comment respectfully to another person's RLA.	You respond briefly to another person's RLA.
